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The Mission



CAMP ONE STEP MISSION

Camp One Step provides year-round camp experiences to kids with cancer and their families that foster joy, belonging, confidence, and life-long friendships.

HEROES MISSION

The Camp One Step ("cos") Heroes program will empower camper families to build a stronger community by connecting our camper families with each other and with Camp One Step.

- Increase the community among camper families, our staff, and our partners, donors, and supporters.
- Campers' families will advocate by attending events that support Camp One Step, and through sharing of their experience, including possible speaking opportunities at Camp One Step events.
- Heroes may also support Camp One Step through social media by sharing upcoming events, programming, or any new updates.
- Heroes will create a welcoming environment for new camper families by partnering with new/first-time camper families to orient and guide them through the Camp One Step program experience.



Defining a Hero

Heroes are current participants of COS Camps and Experiences, aged 13+ and can come from our pediatric cancer patient camps and our sibling or family camps. Heroes may be partnered with a younger **Junior Hero** to mentor at events or throughout the year and will take part in training specific to their age demographic.

Junior Heroes are current participants of COS Camps and Experiences, aged 5-12 and can come from our pediatric cancer patient camps and our sibling or family camps. Junior Heroes may be partnered with an older **Hero** participant for mentoring at events or throughout the year and may take part in training specific to their age demographic. Junior Heroes may age into being Heroes.

Swinging into Action

TIME COMMITMENT

Heroes and Junior Heroes will be expected to participate in Heroes training for a minimum of a year in order to complete all required training for certification as a Hero/Junior Hero.

Once certified, Heroes and Junior Heroes will be eligible to be called up for support opportunities.

After completion of certification, Heroes and Junior Heroes are welcome to continue with participation in Heroes training events but it will not be required.

TRAINING

Heroes and Junior Heroes will be trained by attending bimonthly meetings



APPLICATION

Applications will be available on a rolling year basis. You are welcome to apply at any time.

CERTIFICATION

Upon completion of one year of Heroes training, Heroes and Junior Heroes will be presented with a certificate of completion that will enable them to be called upon to assist with In-Person tabling events, donor cultivation and stewardship support, social media support, and camper-to-camper connections.



Hero Activities and Events

Once certified, Heroes may be asked to support various activities and events, such as donor artwork, speaking engagements, or tabling events. For in-person events, Heroes must be accompanied by an adult and provide their own transportation unless otherwise noted.





Once a Hero Always a Hero

After completion of certification, Heroes and Junior Heroes will always be ready to answer the call. If Heroes or Junior Heroes would like to be removed from the alumni list they should email hsmith@camponestep.org

The Heroes Code

All Heroes follow a code.

This is the Code of the COS Hero:

Heroes are respectful at **all times**

Heroes **always** promote COS positively & safely
